## CSS Cheat Sheet from WPThemerKit.com

Note: this cheat sheet doesn't have every single possibility on it, but hopefully it will be enough to get you going.

The Style.css files are now divided into 11 sections for easier reference. This will make our lives easier when it comes time to upgrade a theme if there has been CSS changes to the core themer kit.

### **SECTION 1 - *the main containers***

#wrapper – *surrounds all the main div's*

#header – *the top or head of the document*

#main - *surrounds content div and sidebar div*

#content - *where the content goes*

#sidebar, #sidebar-small, #sidebar-right, #sidebar-left

#footer – *the bottom of the document*

### **SECTION 2 - *general classes***

.description - *ex. just another wordpress weblog (in header)*

.post - *surrounds the post on index page and regular pages*

.entry-content - *the beef of the post*

.entry-meta - *surrounds "posted in" and "# comments"*

.catposted - ex. **posted in**..... (this class is inside of .entry-meta)

.comments - ex. **1 comment** (this class is inside of .entry-meta)

.entry-text - *the beef of the post on single.php*

.underpost - ex. *this entry posted on tuesday in sandwiches*.....

.navigation - *next post and previous post*

.avatar – *styles the gravatars in comments*

### **SECTION 3 - style for content and footer links**

#content a:link, #content a:visited

#footer a:link, #footer a:visited

### **SECTION 4 - style for menu, page links in the header**

#menu - *main navigation, 1<sup>st</sup> level pages*

#menu li a:link - *for regular links*

#menu .current\_page\_item – *class for current link, set by the WordPress software itself*

### **SECTION 5 – sidebar links**

#sidebar ul – *the main unordered list*

#sidebar ul ul – *targets blocks of links in unordered lists*

#sidebar li a:link – *all links in the sidebar in lists*

#sidebar ul ul li – *just line items in menu blocks*

## **SECTION 6 – *the headings***

#header h1 a:link – *the main title of the site, header link to home*

#content h1, #sidebar h1, #sidebar h2

.post h2, .post h3

## **SECTION 7 – *the post date***

.entry-date - *ex. AUG 23, 2007*

.entry-author - *ex. by John*

.entry-month - *ex. AUG*

.entry-day - *ex. 23*

## **SECTION 8 – *comment form and comments***

ol.commentlist - *ordered list of comments*

ol.commentlist li – *style the line items*

.commentmetadata - *ex. august 21, 2007 at 4:55 am*

.comment-author - *ex. Mr. WordPress Says*

.comment-text - *the beef of the comment*

#content ol.commentlist li a – *the links in comments*

#respond – *surrounds the form*

#respond p – *style text on form, ex. **Message:***

## **SECTION 9 – blockquotes**

blockquote – *the entire blockquote*

blockquote p:first-letter – *style the first letter of the quote*

## **SECTION 10 – alignments and images**

.alignleft - *simple class that aligns things left*

.alignright - *simple class that aligns things right*

img.alignleft, div.alignleft – *aligns image left*

img.alignright, div.alignright – *aligns image right*

img.aligncenter, div.aligncenter – *centers the image*

.wp-caption-text – *captions below images in a post*
